Read a book about Harriet Tubman. Create a "story map" that illustrates the important events and situations that took place in Harriet Tubman's life. Show how Harriet overcame difficulties or challenges on your story map.

Directions for creating a story map:

- 1. On a blank sheet of paper, draw pictures and write words that show situations, people and events that were important to Harriet Tubman's life story.
- 2. Draw lines to connect one picture to another, to show how they are related to one another.
- 3. Show at least **five events** that you read about. This will include **problems, with the solutions** that Harriet found to overcome difficulties.

Attached is an example of a story map. This is an open-ended activity, meaning that your story map will look different than this one, which was created by a talented 6th grade student, to illustrate characters and situations found in *The Adventures of Odysseus*. This map does not illustrate problems and solutions, like yours will, and it shows 10 pictures, whereas you are only required to show **five**. This does, however, give you an idea of what a story map looks like. Have fun with this!
