

Read a book about Harriet Tubman. Create a "**story map**" that illustrates the important events and situations that took place in Harriet Tubman's life. Show how Harriet overcame difficulties or challenges on your story map.

Directions for creating a story map:

1. On a blank sheet of paper, draw pictures and write words that show situations, people and events that were important to Harriet Tubman's life story.
2. Draw lines to connect one picture to another, to show how they are related to one another.
3. Show at least **five events** that you read about. This will include **problems, with the solutions** that Harriet found to overcome difficulties.

Attached is an example of a story map. This is an open-ended activity, meaning that **your story map will look different than this one**, which was created by a talented 6th grade student, to illustrate characters and situations found in *The Adventures of Odysseus*. This map does not illustrate problems and solutions, like yours will, and it shows 10 pictures, whereas you are only required to show **five**. This does, however, give you an idea of what a story map looks like. Have fun with this!
