## K-6 Teacher - Hillary Harm



Hillary Harm grew up in Boise, Idaho, but has lived all over the United States. (16 different cities and 9 different states, at last count.) She graduated from Linfield College with a degree in Elementary Education, also spending six months studying at the Universidad de Costa Rica in Central America. Hillary earned her Master's Degree in Education, with an emphasis in bilingual education, from Boise State University in 2019.

She first became involved in classical education in 1993, and has continued to learn and grow in this field over the past thirty years. Her favorite subjects to teach are Math, Latin, and Literature. This is her tenth year teaching in a public school, and her fifth year teaching at Xavier.

She and her husband have three adult sons, a daughter-in-law, and 2 grandchildren. Hillary has been an

- Q. What do you like about teaching in a charter school?
